 - Summer vacation


- Things that felt difficult or challenging for me while I was in High School were:

 - I started freelancing as a graphic designer for a nightclub during my 4th year of college, and got to work on fun projects like designing the club's logo and invitations for special events


- Things that felt difficult or challenging for me while I was in College were:

 - Critiques of our work often felt harsh, so it was important to learn how to take feedback in a non-personal way and instead use it in a positive way to improve my skills

GETTING A JOB AFTER COLLEGE


- The top few things I did to ensure I got a good job after college were:
 - Created an online portfolio of my work and posted it on a free job board for the creative industry
 - Used a recruiting agency
 - Reached out to companies with my resume and portfolio even it they weren't hiring

 - I work on edits to existing projects and/or start new projects, send cost estimates for new projects, invoice clients, track my time
 - I work from home to save costs on office space, most of my clients are in New York or Minnesota, so I spend a lot of time on the phone and answering emails – it's important to be responsive when working remotely

I started as a Graphic Designer, following the lead of the Art Director


MY CAREER

- The first job I had after college was:
 - I went to a recruiting firm called Aquent and got a "permalance" (long-term freelance) assignment as a graphic designer for a Lincoln Electric, a welding manufacturer
- The worst job I have ever had was:
 - It was my first job I had hoped to get a job in an advertising agency but instead was in a very corporate culture. I had to punch a time clock in and out. Our boss was very strict about being on time, and he once sent me home (unpaid) because I was 15 minutes late to work during a bad snow storm. He lived farther away then I did and still made it in on time – his favorite saying was "being on time is being at your desk 5 minutes early"

MY CAREER

- Challenges I have had to overcome throughout my career are:
 - Being in college you have lots of creative freedom, but after college you need to channel your creativity to meet the needs of the client and their marketing and brand strategy
 - When I first graduated the economy wasn't great, so it was hard to find a full time position – but I went to a recruiting agency and found a freelance position instead
 - Working in advertising was fast paced and long hours, but it makes you grow and become more confident in your work
 - Keeping a steady flow of clients never put all your eggs in one basket as marketing budgets can change
